started cutting a few of my strips, and here's what I have learned so far:

- Have a list handy of the specific cuts you need for background and colored fabrics. These are included for each pattern in the book.
- Bring some zip lock bags of various sizes along with pieces of paper and a pen so you can store your pieces and label each bag. You will need the same number of bags as groupings of pieces you will be cutting. Organization is key.
- Use your book, rotary cutter with a new blade, a mat, your 22 inch ruler and a Stripology ruler if you have one. If you don't, no worries you can use one of ours.
- To maximize cutting accuracy, have your FQs and your background fabric all squared up, pressed, and ready to cut.

I also use my GO cutter and my 1.5 inch die. and I think a couple of others do the same. That makes the strip cutting MUCH faster and easier. We are happy to share and help each other because that's what quilting peeps do !!!

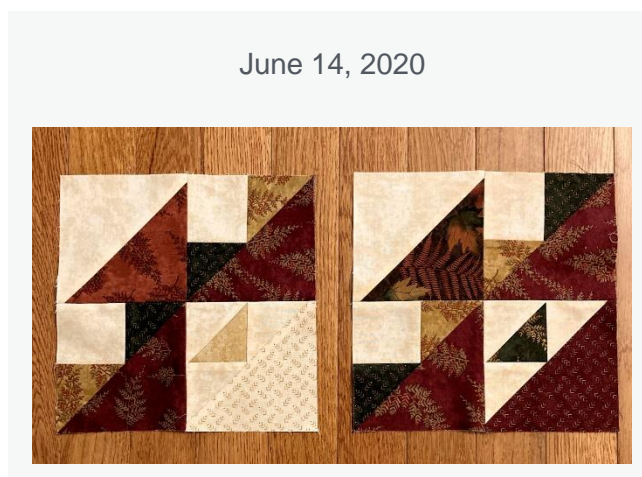

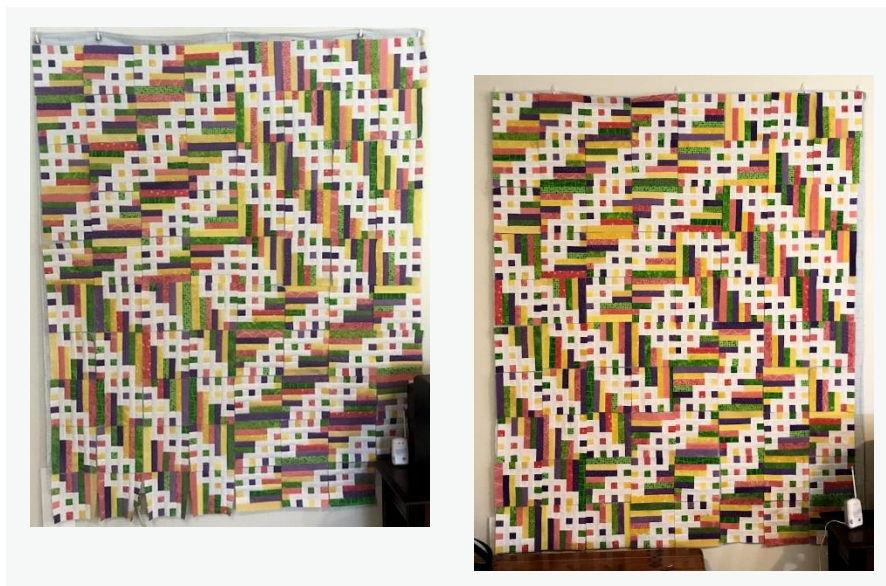


June 6, 2020

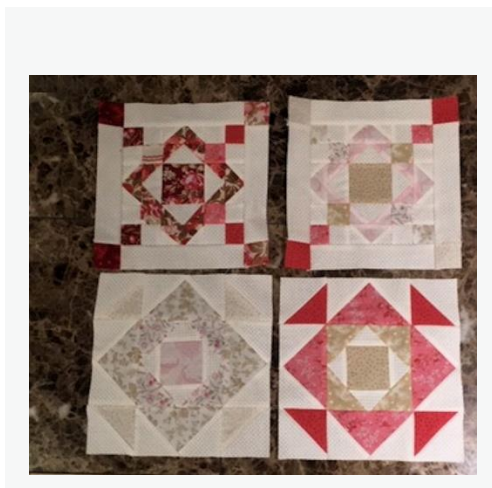

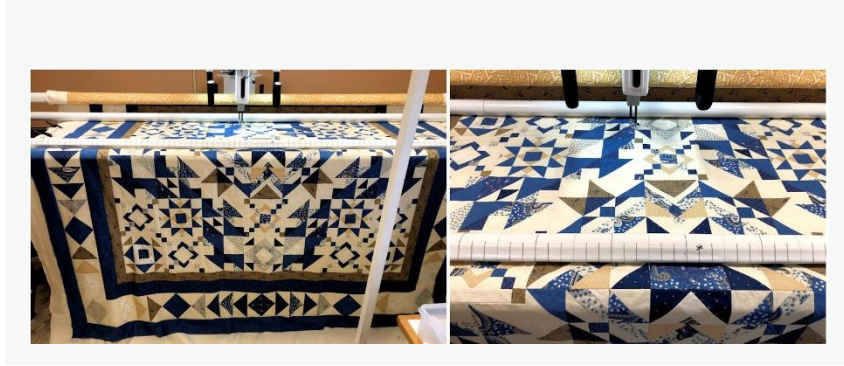
